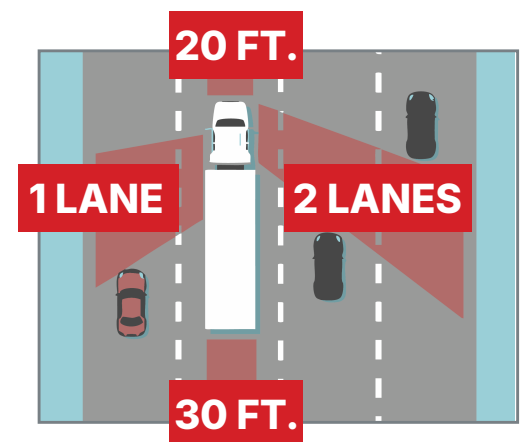
Avoid Blind Spots

Don't linger in blind spots. A good rule of thumb is that if you can't see a truck or bus driver's face in their mirror, they can't see you.



Be Aware of Long Stopping Distances

Large trucks and buses need the length of up to two football fields to safely stop. Leave extra space when merging in front of these large vehicles.



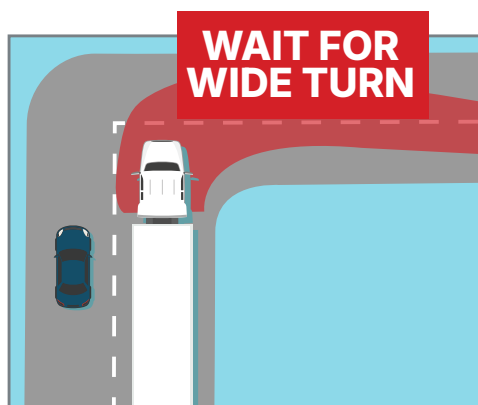
Know the No Zone

When you are passing a commercial vehicle, know the truck cannot see you one lane on the left and two lanes on the right, 20 feet in front and 30 in back.



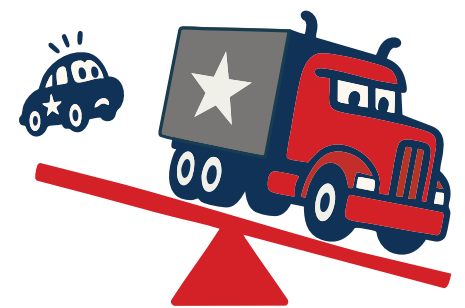
More Than Just 18-wheelers

Commercial motor vehicles include delivery vans, utility trucks, buses, and more.



Anticipate Wide Turns

Trucks and buses need extra space and time to make wide turns carefully. Wait for large vehicles to finish turning before continuing your journey.



Big Rigs Weigh More Than Passenger Cars

Commercial vehicles can weigh 20-30x more than a car. That can be a crushing difference. Steer clear.
